BARRIE CASSIDY.

Barrie Cassidy is one of Australia's most experienced political journalists, having covered federal politics since the late 1970s. In the late 1980s, he was senior press secretary and political adviser to Prime Minister, Bob Hawke. Barrie has worked as a political correspondent for ABC TV News and the 7.30 Report and currently hosts Insiders, the popular Sunday morning political discussion program.

Born in Wangaratta, and with many brothers and an elder sister, Barrie grew up in Chiltern, attending Rutherglen High School and with a love of football and sports.

Starting his career as a cadet on the Albury Border Morning Mail in 1969, Barrie moved to the Shepparton News before being hired as a court reporter for the Melbourne Herald. He then joined the ABC Network, initially covering state politics before moving to Canberra in 1979 to become the ABC's federal political correspondent for radio and television.

In 1986 Barrie became Prime Minister Bob Hawke's personal press secretary, remaining in the job until 1991, leaving just prior to Paul Keating becoming leader. He has described this period as the most rewarding and interesting of his life.

In 2010 Barrie took time out to write The Party Thieves: The Real Story of the 2010 Election (Melbourne University Press, October 2010). In 2013 he co-authored with his son Adam, An Ocean of Cricket: Pictures from the Pacific, a magnificent photographic tour of the grass-roots tournaments, the roadside rubbers and the beachfront battles of cricket, island-style.

In 2014, Barrie wrote Private Bill: In Love and War, a heart-warming story of his father, Bill, and mother, Myra, and how, as a loving couple, they prevailed over the adversities of war to live an extraordinarily ordinary, happy life.

He is married to the 7.30 Report's political correspondent, Heather Ewart, host of ABC TV's Back Roads program, and has two children, Caitlin and Adam.
